About International Compost Awareness Week

International Composting Awareness Week (ICAW) is the largest educational initiative of the composting industry. The goal is to raise awareness of all the benefits when composting food and green organics! New Zealand, though small, plays a significant role in raising awareness about the benefits of composting and enriching our soils.their food waste reduction journey.

This year's theme for ICAW is **Sustainable Communities Begin with Compost**! Because when we're repurposing the food that would go into the landfill, we're creating fresh nutrients for the soil, which regenerates the earth and provides healthier food for everyone in the community.

The WasteMINZ Organic Materials Sector Group is bringing ICAW to Aotearoa New Zealand this year, and has pulled together information and resources for this digital campaign.

To mark International Composting Awareness Week, we're launching a digital campaign to get more people thinking about composting before they throw their food or garden waste in the bin.

CAMPAIGN MESSAGING

On the following pages, you'll find a selection of ready-to- use campaign assets to engage and inform your audience. These can be used alongside suggested social copy or create your own with the key messages below!

- Did you know, an estimated 300,000 tonnes of food scraps is produced annually in NZ, most of which still go to landfill?
- Each household creates approximately 86kg of food scraps per year.
- This International Composting Awareness Week, we are encouraging households and communities to explore the benefits of composting and start your composting journey!
- Instead of viewing food scraps and organic materials (such as lawn and garden clippings) as waste, we should view it as a resource.
- Composting empowers communities to manage their own waste, create job opportunities and support healthy soils with locally made compost.
- Composting organics is beneficial for the community, the environment and for your garden. It reduces waste in landfills, recycles nutrients to enrich soil, helps minimise greenhouse gas emissions, and creates a valuable soil amendment (compost) leading to healthier plants and a more sustainable environment.

Considerations when using key messages:

- Humour is well suited to a 'serious' topic and can be effective when used to gain attention, lighten the mood, increase recall or soften messages that elicit guilt.
- Catchy titles and straplines can reinforce a call to action.
- Make sure you use the following hashtags when sharing social media content: #icaw2025, #sustainablecommunities, #compost
- Suggestions or questions that involve individuals in the action or asking them to try something can be effective.
